# **CLIL** in Lithuania

### **IN PLACE**

- CLIL / EMILE projects offer experience and expertise since 2003.
- The Curriculum (Lth. Bendrieji ugdymo planai) allows to use contact teaching hours (of a subject or of a foreign language) allocated to meet individual learners' needs for subject modules.
- CLIL could be taught by subject teachers, teachers of foreign languages, or a pair of teachers.

# **CLIL** in Lithuania

### **IN PLACE**

- The Curriculum defines CLIL as
  - "learning the content of a subject in a foreign language".
- The aim of CLIL is
  - "developing both the competence in the subject and language competence".
- The prerequisite is for
  - the subject and language teachers to develop a joint syllabus.

## The Interface

The aim of CLIL is to develop both the competence in the subject and the competence in the language.

# **New roles for teachers**

- Language teachers should learn to support subject teachers.
- Subject teachers should learn to be more explicit about language.
